Flames Destroy 4 Businesses in Grand Terrace

Early in the morning of September 17<sup>th</sup> a fire broke out in the EZ Mart Market and quickly spread to the other 3 businesses of the Terrace Village Plaza located across from Demetri's Restaurant on Barton Road just west of the I-215 Freeway. The 3 alarm fire brought in 60 fire fighters that struggled for about 3 hours to douse the flames. The walls of the businesses are still standing but the roof caved in on EZ Mart, A-1 Cleaners, JC Stylez Hair and Nail Salon and a florist shop. The fire is being investigated as suspicious after the owner of the EZ Mart noticed that the counter top ATM machine was damaged. Demetri, the owner of the complex, said that someone had attempted to break into the side of the machine with a blow torch. Damage is estimated to be more than \$1 million dollars. If you look closely, you can see the reflection of the EZ MART sign in the water at the bottom of the picture.







Multiple Sclerosis hasn't dampened Alan's enthusiasm. He often speaks out about having a positive attitude facing life's challenges and encourages others to have hope. The father of eight boys, Alan will also speak about the importance of families and how communities can strengthen them.

During the event, Judge Paul Zellerbach will be honored as the first recipient of the "Peggy Fouke-Wortz" (Champion of the Family" Award. ### Future local changes being considered

Future changes being considered in Highgrove is the addition of an AM/ PM gas station on the south west corner of Center St. and Iowa Avenue. Center St. Tire that is located on the west side of this property may be moved to a location across from Zorba's. And speaking of Zorbas, we may see a new Chinese restaurant on their property south of their present location on Iowa Avenue. Other improvements under consideration include a new facade improvement for Riverside Smog on the north east corner of Center St. and Iowa Ave. and the La Frontera Market located on the north side of Chris' Burgers.

We thank Supervisor Marion Ashley and the Riverside County Economic Development Agency for all of the improvements that have been made to our community. Other completed projects that they are to be thanked for are the beautiful award winning "Welcome to Highgrove" entry monument at the I-215 northbound Center St. exit. And also for the two other Highgrove monuments on Iowa Ave., one for southbound traffic near Main St. and another one

for northbound traffic near Villa St in the center divider. These have been in place for quite a while but their importance and beauty should not be taken for granted. We have also seen improvements to other businesses in Highgrove such as Reliable Tire, Iowa Avenue Market, Tacos El Jr. #6, The Good News Missionary Baptist Church and the old Hughes appliance store that was recently completed. These improvements not only make our community look better, but they provide our residents with a more pleasing place to shop locally. With the high price of gasoline it even makes more sense to shop locally. The next time you get in your car to go shopping for something, patronize our local businesses. Economic Development Agency takes Highgrove by storm! The Riverside County Economic Development Agency is working to assist with the attraction of commercial and retail development to the area.

Bixby Land Co. has been persuaded to earmark the front portion of their property for retail development at Garfield Ave. and Center St. on their 40 acres west of the school. EDA is also in the process of designing guidelines to put into place consistent utilization of historic architectural treatments, land-scaping, signage and theming. This will be based on input from the Highgrove community through the Highgrove Municipal Advisory Council, the Redevelopment Agency, the Community Services Division and County Planning. The Community Services Division is also moving to design a community trail system utilizing the right of way for the canal and the Springbrook Wash.

#### Does Annexation 106-(East Blaine) take part of CSA 126?

We recently learned that there is a plan to annex 1,490 acres of land to the City of Riverside. The map indicates that a portion of that annexation may be within the existing boundaries of County Service Area 126 which is known as the Highgrove area. The plan will go to the city council in about a month and if approved it will then go to LAFCO. There is quite a bit of opposition by the residents. There are 19 residents in the area and if at least 25% of the registered voters within the annexation area sign a protest, then it has to go to a vote of the registered voters in the area. If 50% sign a protest, or if there is a vote and it gets

less than 50% then it is dead.

We will be watching to see if these boundaries that are on exhibit 7 actually go through part of CSA 126. We thank Richard Block for his response to our questions and for providing important information to us that may or may not determine where the line is drawn.



#### HIGHGROVE MAC PASSES RESOLUTION

The Highgrove Municipal Advisory Council has passed a resolution asking Supervisor Marion Ashley and the Riverside County Transportation Department to expedite the re-opening of Mt. Vernon Avenue.

The paving is completed but there is a barrier at the south end of Mt. Vernon Ave. at Palmyrita Avenue. This K-rail barrier blocks traffic from going through this location. Formerly, traffic could proceed between Mt. Vernon and Palmyrita Ave. via the old Horse-shoe Bend where the road went down one

side of the arroyo and up the other side. At the bottom of Horseshoe Bend was where Pigeon Pass Road started but Mt. Vernon now goes straight across the arroyo and is blocked by the Krail






The passenger track speed at this location is 60 mph and the platform for the existing trains would be located on straight track. Just stopping the existing trains does not violate the Feb. 14, 1996 train movement agreement between RCTC and BNSF because there are no additional trains added between San Bernardino and Riverside. The trains are already there-but they need to stop just long enough for passengers. The curved track would intersect the BNSF railroad from the right side of the above picture. Our freeways are so congested and the gasoline prices are so high that many commuters have turned to park and ride. Highgrove is the perfect location to park and ride because the platform would serve commuters in 3 directions: to and from Riverside using existing trains, to and from San Bernardino using existing trains, and to and from Perris when the Perris Valley Line is completed. The Perris Valley Line railroad also needs a completely new signal system to run commuter trains. There are no signals for any trains except for the ones on each side of the railroad junction where the Union Pacific track crosses the Perris Valley Line track at Marlborough Avenue. Additional passing tracks or sidings will have to be built and new engines and coaches will be needed. And their is no rail connection at the other end of the Perris Valley Line because the track dead ends at San Jacinto. But the real question is: How will their trains get between Riverside and Perris without the 17 acres of vacant land at Highgrove?









During the proposed re-construction time of 3 years for the Perris Valley Line track to be up-graded there will be almost 10,000 commuter trains that pass through Highgrove that do not stop. Here are the figures: Highgrove now has commuter train service 7 days a week. There are 62 commuter trains each

week or 3,224 trains per year. Three years of construction time is equivalent to 9,672 commuter trains that could take thousands of vehicles off the freeways during this period. These figures are not freight train figures but trains that transport people by rail. The platform should be in Highgrove!





## GOOD NEWS AT LAST

"Riverside County has received word from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development that we are slated to receive \$48.5 million dollars in federal funds under the Neighborhood Stabilization Program. These funds will be used for the purchase of foreclosed homes, the rehabilitation of foreclosed homes, to demolish or rehabilitate abandoned properties, and or to offer down-payment and closing cost assistant to lowmoderate income families currently living in Riverside County. While the County will administer the program we will coordinate and work with our 14 cooperating cites to carry out the program. We will take our operations plan to the Board of Supervisors for direction, review, and approval on October 21, 2008. Shortly after that review and approval pro-



cess is complete we will transmit approved documents to HUD and HUD will provide the funding for implementation. While receiving these funds is a great boost to our county and we are grateful for the assistance, this is not something to celebrate as it is yet one more reminder of the state of our housing market We will have no further information or comment on this program until we have received direction and guidance from the Board of Supervisors."

### got bones?

Any problem catching your **ZZZZZZZZ**?

A good night's sleep is *not* overrated. Good sleep is essential to your physical, mental and emotional well being. The National Sleep Foundation in the United States maintains that "eight to nine hours of sleep adult humans is optimal and that sufficient sleep benefits mental alertness, memory and problem solving, and overall health, as well as reducing the risk of accidents; cognitive performance declines with fewer than eight hours of sleep."

Sleep is restorative, not just for that wonderful rested feeling, but sleep is also necessary for the body to heal, normal growth of tissue and muscle, and to help you think sharper. The lack of sleep will have a negative effect on all of the above.

What can go wrong with your sleep? The two most common sleep disorders are insomnia which creates a lack of sleep and obstructive sleep apnea.

Insomnia can be created by diet such as too much caffeine or alcohol, emotional difficulties, stress, or an underlying disease. Left untreated, it can become chronic. The best way to treat insomnia is, obviously, to remove the causes. Avoiding caffeine and alcohol after 4 pm, doing gentle relaxation exercises before going to bed, and working on the emotional problems that are weighing on your mind can help remove causes of sleeplessness. If those don't work for you, be sure to see your doctor to have any underlying diseases diagnosed and treated.

Obstructive sleep apnea is becoming more common over time. As Americans as a group gain weight, the increased weight creates an obstruction in the breathing pathways and disturbs the airflow and reduces oxygen to the brain. The obvious correction is to lose weight. However, some forms of sleep apnea also require the use of a CPAP machine. This machine, prescribed by your doctor after you

undergo a sleep study, help keep the breathing pathway open and air flowing to your lungs and oxygen to your brain. CPAP- continuous positive airway pressure- is used to treat obstructive apnea and also "central apnea", a condition where the brain "forgets" to breathe while sleeping.

Aside from the disorders that cause poor sleep or a lack of sleep, there are often simple causes and fixes. How old is that bed of yours? Did you get it from grandma when you got your first apartment? And she had it for 15 years before that? Do you have to flip and fold your pillow to get comfortable? Do you have dogs, cats or kids who share your bed? Do you stay up late and watch the talk shows and then get up at the crack of dawn for work or school? Is your bedroom too hot or too cold? Are there annoying noises disturbing you? Obvious fixes here!

Since I am a chiropractor, I often get asked what kind of bed is the best to sleep on. Choose a bed that is comfortable. When shopping for a bed, spend some time on them. Don't just lie down for 15 seconds on your back, bounce your bottom on it, or push it with your hands. You have to kick off your shoes, curl up and settle in for a minute or so. Some stores offer a period of time for you to try the bed at home. If it doesn't suit you, you can return it. The type of bed is up to you; get whatever is comfortable. Pillow top, firm, soft, Tempur-Pedic; all are good. Please avoid the "any size for \$99!!" You cannot get good and cheap in one package. Don't try to save money on your bed or your pillows. Get the very best you can afford. If you cannot find and fix your sleep problems within a week, please talk to your doctor. Going without a good night's sleep more than a few nights will cause you problems very quickly. Life is too short to spend it with sleepless nights!
